The Sit With Me red chair creates an instant photo opportunity. It only takes a little preparation to ensure that you'll come away with pictures that pop — perfect for publicity, social media, and future promotions.

## **TRY THESE TIPS:**

- Consider designating someone as a "team photographer" who can take pictures throughout the event.
- Utilize a custom banner as a backdrop to create that "red carpet" vibe. (No backdrop? Position the chair in front of a blank wall, if possible.)
- Invite individuals or small groups to sit in the red chair. Sitting isn't the only option; get creative!
- Provide paper or a whiteboard for people to write their reasons for supporting women in technology.
- Take multiple shots of each person or group to maximize the chances of getting one that's "just right."

And, don't forget about video! Short clips of individuals sharing "why they sit" can make great social media content. Longer videos might find a home on your organization's website, or form part of a presentation on why diversity in tech is so important.
